Treasurers Report: Tim Davidson:

I hereby present my first report as acting Treasurer and firstly I must thank most sincerely the assistance that has been afforded me by Barry McDonald and Nathan Tilbury.

I have spent the holiday period trying to update the financial records as well as prepare the budget for the 2011/12 season and finalise a number of outstanding matters and I report as follows:

- **Current Financial Position**
 - Balance of accounts with Westpac
 - Cash management Account \$18,195.65
 - Ground Maintenance Account \$10,930.53
 - Deposit Bearing Account \$25,015.81
 - Community Solutions Account \$15,044.48
 - Cash Management No 2 \$9,002.05
 - Term deposit \$57,876.69
 - The above balances are after paying Hornsby Shire Council \$50,176 for grounds but it is before paying Ku-ring-gai Council \$30,482. I ask that all outstanding invoices be paid as soon as possible so we can finalise the payments to Council etc. I can advise that internet banking has now been restored.
- **Budget**
 - The budget for 2011/12 has been drafted and will be presented to the executive for their review before being presented to the Clubs in the near future. At this point I can advise that the fees for both senior and juniors have been kept at the rates included in the interim invoices that were issued prior to Christmas.
- **Kookaburra Rebates**
 - I have been asked to resolve this matter as soon as possible but I may need the assistance of each club as the records that I have been provided are a bit light on information. I cannot locate the information regarding the number of each type of balls that each club purchased during the 2010/11 season so if that information can be provided the rebate can be finalised.
- **ATO**
 - The BAS for the September quarter has not been lodged and so I will be preparing this ASAP and also preparing the BAS for the December quarter.
- **Invoices**
 - As soon as the budget is adopted the invoices for season 2011/12 will be issued and these invoices will include 2010/11 umpire fees, captains ticket course fees, scorebooks etc.
- **General**
 - I ask that when you are directly depositing funds into the Association accounts that you clearly state the details of the deposit.
 - When you are depositing funds manually please forward a copy of the deposit slip and the details to me so I can ensure that the information is correctly recorded in the books of the Association.
 - There have been a number of deposits made this year without any description or advice to assist in identifying the source of the deposit.
- **Other matters that will be looked at when time permits includes the need for so many bank accounts, streamlining the reporting and payment function etc.**



Juniors Report: Bruce Kimberley:

Representative Report: Abbas Aly:

- Tournament updates
 - U12 – Lismore tournament
 - The U12 played in a series of games in Lismore and it was a great experience for the boys especially those who filled in for the players unable to attend. The team finished second in their pool winning 2 of their 3 matches unfortunately they did not progress to the finals. Judy has mentioned that team had a great time and enjoyed the tournament. Thank you to Coach Josh Miller who travelled with boys.
 - U13 Ballina tournament
 - This was a mixed team of rep players and club players and they performed extremely well winning 3 matches from 5 and going very close to beat a full strength shield squad. There is a special mention here for Travis Loxton and Anthony Johnston as captain and vice captain they looked after the new players and ensured everyone had a fair chance. These tournaments are meant to be a bit of fun and enjoying playing on turf wickets.
 - U14 – Graeme Marshall Shield – Newcastle
 - Well the U14 did it again in a mixed team of Shield, President Cup and Club players they went through undefeated and won everything on offer. Congratulations to Daniel Heideger winning the Batsmen of the tournament.
 - Telegraph Shield
 - The telegraph shield is currently coming second on the table 1 point behind the leaders, and playing quite well, and have qualified through to the semifinals.
 - President Cup – Tournament
 - This year this series has really been affected by bad weather and terrible grounds, with 3 rounds left to play some of the age groups can finish on top, hopefully weather will hold.
- Emerging Blues – Nominations
 - This program has now been changed to Cricket NSW Academy. The committee has decided to strictly follow the rules set out by the DCA and to make nomination selections transparent the process is the top 2 batsmen by aggregate and the top 2 bowlers by wickets will be nominated, there is a nomination that is available for someone who may have performed better if given greater opportunity and this was done in consultation with the coach, manager and statistics.
 - Those boys who were in the Emerging Blues program automatically go through.
 - I will provide a list of all boys nominated at the next meeting.

HKHDCUA (Umpires) Report: Steve Wilson:

- The season is unfolding very well for the Umpires.
 - The holiday period has given us the opportunity to encourage the newer members to stand in games with the more experienced umpires which has been well received by the teams and the newer and more experienced umpires.
 - It has been decided that this practice will continue now up to the semi-finals as it gives our less experienced umpires more confidence in their ability to act under pressure and as a reward for their outstanding efforts to date. It also encourages strong competition for all umpires for the end of season matches.
- Cost for the December – January up to and including 14/1/12 is \$3,435.00.

- All captains are requested to make sure they score each umpire and the grounds promptly after each match as this is important information for the end of season games. Fines and penalties will be applied for any indiscretions as per the senior competition rules.

HKHDCCA (Coaches) Report: Bruce Wood:

- School holiday cricket clinics:
 - The Coaches' Association is in the middle of its busiest time of the year, with the school holiday cricket clinics in full swing.
 - HKHDCCA conducted a successful cricket clinic at Kenthurst Park from 11-13 January, with 31 boys and 5 accredited coaches in attendance.
 - Bruce thanked Col Griffin, President, Kenthurst / Upper Hills CC, for being there on all three days and assisting our staff in many ways.
 - Col Griffin advised that it was a highly impressive coaching clinic, which received excellent feedback from the participants and their parents.
 - Bruce further advised that the second cricket clinic is underway at Mark Taylor Oval, Waitara (16-18 January), with a record number of registrations (66). A further 15-20 registration requests had to be knocked back after we reached our capacity for the venue, indicating the popularity of the clinics.
 - HKHDCCA engaged a very capable team of coaches at the clinics, comprising Rod Hokin (Head Coach), Bruce Wood (Co-ordinator), Andrew Lowe, David Lowery, Justin Epthorp, Mike Burgin, Daniel Wood, Josh Miller, James Madden, Daniel Anderson & Chris Burnett (all Level 2 or 1 accredited coaches).
 - It is pleasing to have a high number of young players returning each clinic and to see their continual improvement, under the guidance of our coaches. The boys' improvement was clearly evident when batting and bowling in the nets and fielding / game drills on the oval, especially after they put into practise what they had learnt during the video analysis coaching sessions.
 - The Hills News attended the Kenthurst cricket clinic and included an article in their newspaper and online - www.hillsnews.com.au/news/local/sport/cricket/hills-cricket-clinics-set-for-boys-and-girls/2421187.aspx, which includes a photo gallery from the clinic on the Hills News website.
 - One of HK&HDCA's generous sponsors, Triforce Sports, again provided a free (size 4 or 5) Slazenger willow cricket bat to the 72 new registrations at our January 2012 cricket clinics. Thanks to Abbas Aly for this wonderful gesture.
- Glenn Hourigan Cup / Ross Turner Cup:
 - Last season HKHDCCA took over responsibility for the showcase junior representative matches known as the U/13 Glenn Hourigan Cup (GHC) and U/15 Ross Turner Cup (RTC).
 - Bruce advised that he had arranged for these important matches to be played on adjacent ovals for the first time, with the RTC to be played at Kenthurst Oval (turf) and the GHC at Kenthurst No. 2 (astro) Oval on Sunday, 4th March 2012.
 - This will allow HK&HDCA officials, special guests, parents with sons involved in both matches, ND's Green Shield selectors and other interested spectators to check out the action in both matches throughout the day.
 - Last year HKHDCCA successfully introduced a new format to increase the participation in the younger age groups, with preliminary T20 matches for the GHC age groups. Four teams (48 players) have been selected to play in the T20 matches at Montview Oval, Hornsby Heights on Sunday, 19th February, and invitations will be sent to the parents next week.



- Following the T20 matches on 19th February, the selection panel will select the best 24 players to participate in the main Glenn Hourigan Cup match at Kenthurst No. 2 Oval on Sunday, 4th March, which will be a 50 overs (maximum) per team contest.
- More information will be posted on the HK&HDCA website.

President's Report (Nathan Tilbury):

- **MEETING WITH NEW HORNSBY COUNCIL GM, SCOTT PHILLIPS**
 - A delegation from your Executive will meet with the new Hornsby Shire Council General Manager, Scott Phillips this month.
 - We will be expressing a number of concerns this Association has regarding grounds including the turf grounds situation.
 - My first impression of Scott in the few dealings I have had with him is he is a good guy who follows through with what he says. Whilst not a cricketer (he is a surfer) he could be good for our Association and local cricket in general.
 - This will hopefully start to get our relationship back on track with HSC.
- **HSC – Expressions of interest in Rural Sports Facility**
 - HSC have asked for expressions of interest in Rural Sports Facility (Galston Equestrian Centre) opposite Fagan Park of Bayfield rd. This is particularly for Saturday & mid-week use.
 - Your Executive will investigate the possibility of this being used for cricket.
- Other locations we are looking at for possible new grounds in the near future include the old pony club grounds in Laurence St, Pennant Hills which is big enough for a good size senior ground as well as a lower age group junior ground. And Seymour's Gully in Brooklyn, which is big enough for a senior cricket field.
- **HORNSBY SHIRE COUNCIL – UNDERTAKING CORE WORKS**
 - HSC undertaking core works at a number of sportsgrounds over the next week.
 - Council will 'rub out' most coring that is on the surface shortly after works but would like us to be aware of any slightly uneven surfaces. And we should inspect field for safety prior to any use of fields.
 - They say these remediation works should not adversely affect usage of the oval for training, and match play should be able to take place as normal.
 - Grounds that affect us are;
 - Warrina
 - Berowra Oval
 - Foxglove North & South
 - Mt Ku-ring-gai Oval
 - Storey Park
 - Normanhurst Oval
 - Headon Park.
- **HK&HDCA WINTER CRICKET**
 - Several HK&HDCA clubs (ARL, Hornsby, Berowra) participate in the Sydney Winter Cricket Association who hold games mostly in Moore Park & out West.
 - We would like to investigate the possibility of securing some local cricket fields for this winter.
 - Any clubs that plan to participate in winter cricket this year or would like to know more details, please contact me.

Executive Officer Report (Ben Gussey):

- On the ball newsletter:
 - Our next newsletter has a submission due date set for January 23rd.
 - I encourage any articles of interest to be submitted, as well as information of any clubs that are holding a Pink Stumps Day.

- Wet Weather:
 - There have been a few comments made from clubs regarding wet weather policy, particularly via email and social media.
 - It would be appreciated if clubs could inform members that the Association endeavours to allow teams to make decisions at the ground.
 - Our Association covers a large area and calling a blanket closing of grounds may prevent some matches from getting on.
 - We endeavour to help clubs communicate with opposition clubs and all numbers are listed at the front of the rule book.

- Captain Contact Details for Seniors:
 - It would be appreciated if all clubs could pass on the contact details for captain's to pass a once off email from Koindah Waters regarding affiliate rates for possible end of season functions.
 - Email addresses will not be used for ongoing contact but it is important that our sponsors information is filtered down to teams. If you could email myself with contact details it would be appreciated.
 - Additionally, this will help with regards to wet weather and ground last minute ground changes, as Club contacts are not always available on Friday afternoon and Saturday morning.

Seniors Report: Geoff Hasler:

- After Round 10, we have a much more interesting A grade table, with 6 teams very much in the battle for semi final places.
- Kissing Point took the axe to the table topping WPHC side, knocking them over for a total of 36 – which took the Kissing Point guys off the bottom of the table, a position they have held since Round 1, but with three wins out of their past four games, watch out for a few more “upset” results.
- In Kooka Cup, we again have 6 teams vying for the semis, with Mt Colah topping the table and still undefeated through the 10 matches.
- B grade top 4 looks settled, BUT, there are 4 Rounds to go, so who knows what might happen in the two day games, with an outright or two.
- B2 is far from settled, with 6 or 7 teams still in the hunt, with C Grade very open to the top 6 sides, C2 looks like 5 in the fight for the semis, C3 is out of the top 6, D Grade has St Ives well out in front of Kissing Pt, then 6 more sides (in the 10 team comp) fighting it out for the remaining two spots.
- The D2 comp looks a bit more settled, but 6 sides still might make the semis, whilst the Sunday Comp sees Berowra Maroon and Berowra Soccer on top, but it's anyone's guess who will fill up the four.
- Lets hope that we get better weather than we have experienced thus far so that the teams needing wins to qualify get the opportunity to work for an outright.
- It is doubtful that we will get access to Waitara (Mark Taylor) Oval, as ND's seconds are top of the table and will get home games in the semis etc.
- Perhaps we can get Asquith instead – we should see how we go with Hornsby Council on that opportunity.

- Given the chaos that ensued at the last council meeting, I have revisited the penalties, and have only introduced points penalties where results were clearly influenced by the unregistered player(s).



- In the other instances, in Rounds 4 and 5, I am recommending a fine, starting at \$25 for the first offence, and doubling thereafter per club.

It was noted and agreed that these penalties would not be voted on at the Council meeting, i.e., in favour or against, to prevent drawn out debate, and that Clubs could still appeal the proposed penalties.
